### **ABSTRACT**

Abstract should be written in about 100 words.

### **Keywords**

Keywords are your own designated keywords.

### **INTRODUCTION**

We request the author(s) to maintain for the papers high-quality appearance of International standards. To do this, we ask that author(s) to follow some simple guidelines. In essence, we ask you to make your paper look exactly like the document details for pagination.

### **PAGE SIZE**

The page size of the journal is DEMY 1/8 or DEMY OCTAVA exactly corresponding to 14.5 cm × 21.6 cm.

All material on each page should fit within a rectangle of 21 × 29.7 cm, centered on the page, beginning 2 cm from the top of the page and ending with 3.5 cm from the bottom. The right and left margins should be 4 cm. The text must be in one column and the pages must be multiple pages and we select mirror margin.

### **TYPESET TEXT**

*Normal or Body Text*

Please use a 12-point Times Roman font, or other Roman font with serifs, as close as possible in appearance to Times Roman in which these guidelines have been set. The goal is to have a 12-

point text, as you see here. Please use sans-serif or non-proportional fonts only for special purposes, such as distinguishing source code text.

#### *Title and Authors*

The title (Times Roman 18-point bold), authors' names (Times Roman 14-point) and affiliations (Times Roman 12-point) centered. We also recommend phone number (Times Roman 12-point) and e-mail address (Times Roman 12-point). See the top of this page for three addresses. If only one address is needed, center all address text. For two addresses, use two centered tabs, and so on. For more than three authors, you may have to improvise.<sup>1</sup>

#### *References and Citations*

Footnotes should be Times New Roman 10-point, a numbered list at the end of each page and re-numbered in each page. Word may try to automatically 'underline' hotlinks in your references, the correct style is NO underlining.

The references are 11 pt. References should be published materials accessible to the public. Internal technical reports may be cited only if they are easily accessible (i.e. you can give the address to obtain the report within your citation) and may be obtained by any reader. Proprietary information may not be cited. Private communications should be acknowledged, not referenced (e.g., "[Robertson, personal communication]").

#### *Page Numbering, Headers and Footers*

Do not include headers, footers or page numbers in your submission. These will be added when the publications are assembled.

### **FIGURES/DIAGRAM/CAPTIONS**

Diagram and figures should be suitable for photographic/scanner reproduction. Drawings should be in black ink or stiff white paper. Lettering should be of draughtsman standard and large enough to remain legible where the figure requires reduction in size. Tables should be typed on separate sheets. Indicate in the text where tables should be placed.

Place Tables/Figures/Images in text as close to the reference as possible (see Figure 1). It may extend across both columns to a maximum width of 18 cm (7").

Captions should be Times New Roman 12-point bold. They should be numbered (e.g., "Table 1" or "Figure 2"), please note that the word for Table and Figure are spelled out. Figure's captions should be centered above the image or picture, and Table captions should be centered above the table body.

## SECTIONS

The heading of a section should be in Times New Roman 12-point **bold** in all-capitals flush left. Sub-sections should be Times New Roman 12-point *italics*.

### *Subsections*

The heading of subsections should be in Times New Roman 12-point bold with only the initial letters capitalized. (Note: For subsections and sub subsections, a word like *the* or *a* is not capitalized unless it is the first word of the header.)

### *Subsubsections*

The heading for subsubsections should be in Times New Roman 12-point underlined with initial letters capitalized and 6-points of white space above the subsubsection head.

### *Subsubsections*

The heading for subsubsections should be in Times New Roman 12-point with initial letters capitalized.

### *Subsubsections*

The heading for subsubsections should be in Times New Roman 12-point with initial letters capitalized.

## 6. TRANSCRIPTIONS

All the language fonts may be transcribed using Roman alphabets (Broad transcriptions). In case phonetic transcriptions are used, IPA 2005 may be followed.

## 8. REFERENCES

References should follow the system as exemplified in this journal. In the typescript, references should be indicated by giving the author's name and year of publication (with page references where ever necessary). Reference should be listed in full at the end of the article, in alphabetical order and without abbreviating journal title. Author names should be given in small capitals (if you cannot easily set small capitals, please leave them in regular font—do not set them as all capitals and/or in a smaller font size). References to more than one publication by an author in the same year should be distinguished alphabetically with small letters. For example: According to Nida (1994a, 1994b). Please don't club notes with references. Some examples:
